The COVID-19 vaccine is free and any offers to get the vaccine will come from known sources, such as your local or tribal health department, health care provider, pharmacy, or a community-based clinic. You should not accept offers for vaccine or share personal information with an unknown source as these may be fraud.

Mass vaccination clinics are federally supported and provide vaccinations to individuals currently eligible for vaccine. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region 5 provides support for these clinics through collaborations with local health departments and other local partners, the University of Wisconsin, Wisconsin Department of Health Services, and the State of Wisconsin. Wisconsin provides vaccine for the mass vaccination clinics through its state allocation. DHS community-based vaccination clinics provide vaccinations to individuals who live, work, or study in Wisconsin. AMI Expeditionary Healthcare (AMI) operate these community-based vaccination clinics through collaborations with local health departments, the University of Wisconsin (UW), the technical college system, other local partners, and DHS. Community-based vaccination clinics work in tandem with current vaccinators by providing additional vaccine based on current supply. To schedule an appointment at one of these clinics, register through the Wisconsin COVID-19 Vaccine Registry (https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/covid-19/vaccine-registry.htm) or call toll-free at 1-844-684-1064. After registration, individuals will be able to schedule their appointment. Each site is open Tuesday-Saturday 11 a.m.-7 p.m.
